Independent charity – Bath & West Low Carbon Community Fund

Set up in 2014

- Redistribute surplus income to local projects
- Focus on reducing carbon emissions and tackling fuel poverty

Run by nine volunteer Trustees with support from BWCE

Local charity, community, voluntary or self-help groups Small organisations with charitable aims Same geographical area as BWCE Portworthy covered by South Dartmoor Community Energy Particularly welcome applicants close to BWCE projects



### **BWCE Community Benefit**



Bath & West Community Energy Fund

Since 2014, BWCE has given the BWCE Fund £232,000 and has given a further £18,000 to South Dartmoor Community Energy

Total community benefit to date: £250,000





Bath & West Community Energy Fund

To date, the BWCE Fund has handed out grants worth £207,000 to 69 projects representing 48 different local community organisations

### Julian House – Bath Bike Workshop





£4,827 towards running costs Sustainable transport Affordable, second-hand bicycles Employability services for homeless and socially excluded people

Aims: refurbish and sell just under 400 second-hand bikes and support another 40 long-term unemployed people to gain essential employability skills



### **Peter Pan Play School**

£1,000 for bike, scooter and pram shed
Reducing car journeys and increasing exercise
Educating children and parents
Before,16% of their families always drove. Now all of those families walk/scoot at least once a week
Easier and more relaxed commute
Increased scooter/bike skills
